OBJECTIVE / OBJECTIF

This document provides a situational update on airport status and Customs entry points during the COVID-19 pandemic.

COUNTRY BRIEF / COMPTE RENDU

Bhutan was not included in the United Nations' 2020 COVID-19 Global Humanitarian Response Plan (GHRP), with a Humanitarian Response Plan.

AIRPORT STATUS / STATUT DES AEROPORTS

1. Airport / Flight restrictions (updated 1 June 2020)

Bhutan has closed its borders with neighbouring countries and flight operations are significantly reduced.

2. Passengers / Quarantine (updated 1 June 2020)

All travelers, including Bhutanese nationals, who are permitted to enter the country are subject to mandatory quarantine in a facility for 21 days (source: WFP, 1 June 2020).

The visa on arrival procedure is suspended. Passengers with a visa, work permit or other immigration permits issued by Bhutan and airline crew are not allowed to enter Bhutan if they arrive from or have visited or transited through a COVID-19-affected country. Airline crew are subject to thermal screening on arrival. (source: IATA, 20 April 2020).

IMPORTATION AND CUSTOMS / IMPORTATION ET DOUANES

3. Customs, land, sea (updated 7 May 2020)

A number of operational measures have been undertaken. This includes:

- Zero-contact Customs clearance procedures have been established at land borders where consignments and goods are brought into the country in foreign transport vehicles with foreign drivers;
- Health measures have been put in place by the government to contain the spread of COVID-19 across land borders through Customs entry points.

4. Customs, importation procedure (updated 7 May 2020)

The Government of Bhutan signed an agreement with the United Nations concerning measures to expedite the import, export and transit of relief consignments and possession of relief personnel in the event of disasters and emergencies.

A <u>notice</u> from the Bhutan Department of Revenue and Customs stated that changes have been made to normal importation procedures, under the 'Relief of Duty and Taxes' section, and under Section 47 and 75 of the Customs Act of Bhutan, 2017. The government has committed to the following measures:

• **Ensuring an uninterrupted supply** of essential goods into the country, and that smooth cross-border business/trade transactions are maintained without hindrance.



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- **Fast track clearance** of all essential cargo relating to COVID-19 such as testing kits, Personal Protective Equipment, Ventilators, Hand sanitizers, medicines and other equipment.
- Clearances of relief consignments and donations based on government directives.
- The government has **deferred the payment of Customs duties** and taxes by three months from April 2020 to June 2020, for identified importers importing essential goods categorized as basic necessities.
