1.	The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming all the participants. He expressed his thanks for all the intermediate work done by the HWT's and others.

	The Secretary apologised for the delay in the preparation of the reports but confirmed that they will be produced and posted on the website. He suggested, in order to speed up the process, to produce all future reports with less details yet containing all the most important points and decisions.	
	The Chairman observed that, despite the late availability of the latest reports, the Secretary has always provided - within a few days after each session - follow-up notes reflecting the decisions taken and the necessary	

	actions to progress with the work. In view of the high meeting pace of SLR, the production of the reports had to be considered of lower priority compared to the preparation and in time submission of all the SLR proposals to GRE over the years. Nevertheless, he stressed the importance of having official records of each meeting for reference purposes.	
	SLR acknowledged the work done by the Secretary over the years and endorsed his suggestion to produce less detailed reports, in order to help him managing the backlog.	
	Status update on the editorial correction to documents WP.29/2021/30 and WP.29/2021/31 (see SLR-45-10 for information)	
5.	The Secretary reported that the correction will be taken into account by the WP.29 Secretariat, as reflected in the official Report on the 183 <sup>rd</sup> WP.29 session (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1157, para. 85).

7.	- Proposal to correct Par. 5.5.2.1. and Annex 1	SLR-46-08
	Document SLR-46-08 has been reviewed and improved during the discussion, as reflected in the Rev.1 version. Document SLR-46-08/Rev.1 will be submitted to GRE-84 to correct Par. 5.5.2.1. and Annexes 1 and 6.	
	HID colour restrictions	
8.	- Resume discussion on the basis of SLR-45-12 In order to have technology neutral requirements, SLR considered whether the current "Neutral White" colour restrictions for HID should be lifted or, instead, should be extended to all Light Sources, in view of the concerns due to the blue component of LEDs. The discussion will resume at SLR47 on the basis of doc. SLR-45-12 and the outcome of SLR-45.	
	UN Regulation No. 148 (Item 9)	
Items 9. to 12.	The latest draft consolidated document is SLR-46-22/Rev.1. This document, based on SLR-45-08/Rev.1, reflects all the comments and modifications agreed during SLR-46, including the text concerning the "light source / testing issue" agreed in documents SLR-46-11/Rev.1, SLR-46-13/Rev.1 and SLR-46-15/Rev.1. A copy of this document, without comments and highlights, will be sent to GRE-84 along with a presentation explaining the most important modifications done until now (see SLR-46-26).	
	UN Regulation No. 149 (Item 10)  The latest draft consolidated document is SLR-46-01/Rev.2. This document, based on SLR-45-13/Rev.1, reflects all the comments and modifications agreed during SLR46. However, it does not include yet the text to be adapted from the R148 agreed proposals concerning the "light source / testing issue" (i.e. SLR-46-11/Rev.1, SLR-46-13/Rev.1 and SLR-46-15/Rev.1).	

The "Homework Team R149" shall finalise this document, along with the accompanying presentation (revision of SLR-41-15/Rev.1), by Friday 2 April 2021. This document will be used to produce a clean version for submission to GRE-84.

Moreover, SLR agreed on the need to correct the 00 series of amendments to R149 regarding paragraphs 3.3.2.4., 3.3.2.4.4. and 3.3.2.4.8..

OICA also identified some corrections needed in the 00 series but could not prepare a proposal in time for consideration by SLR-46. If deemed urgent, OICA will submit these corrections - together with those identified by SLR - to GRE-84 as an OICA informal document. Otherwise, all the corrections will be collected in a SLR proposal that will be submitted to GRE-85 as a formal document from SLR.

#### **UN Regulation No. 150** (Item 11)

The latest draft consolidated document is SLR-46-02/Rev.2. This document, based on SLR-45-20, reflects all the comments and modifications agreed during SLR-46 (including those from document SLR-46-06 and the corrections to Tables 4 and 5 "Chronological order of tests"). The "Homework Team R150" shall finalise this document (including the modifications to Par. 3.3. on markings, see SLR-46-09, and the revised drawings in Annex 21, see SLR-46-07/Rev.1) and the accompanying presentation (see doc. SLR-46-23) by Friday 2 April 2021. This document will be used to produce a clean version for submission to GRE-84.

#### **Correlation tables**

The 3 Homework Teams are invited to further develop, in time for GRE-84, the draft correlation tables between Stage 1 and 2 for each of new device Regulations. These tables are not intended for submission to GRE but rather as a tool for SLR to answer questions during GRE, as well as for keeping track of the evolution of the Regulations from Stage 1 to Stage 2.

#### **Unique Identifier**

Further to the WP.29 endorsement of the SLR concept (see Par. 76. of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1157 "WP.29 invited the IWGs on SLR and DETA to develop the proposal related to the use of DETA in the context of Unique Identifier"), the UI topic will be on the agenda for SLR-47 in order to

	improve the presentation (see DETA-SG-UI-02e rev1) to clarify the minimum/optional contents of the summary documents and avoid any confidentiality issues.  It shall also be clarified that the summary document is merely provided as an example of how it could look like and that the final decision about using UI, with or without summary document, etc. is up to each GR, regardless of the decision that GRE may take on this subject upon the Regulations under its responsibility.  Mr. Puglisi, with the assistance of Mr. Prigent, will contact ETRTO to	
	organise a separate informal meeting, tentatively before SLR-47, to discuss about a possible common approach regarding the UI.	
14.	Number of digits in approval numbers  Mr. Puglisi will ask clarifications to the WP.29 Secretariat regarding the latest status of document WP.29/2018/165, amending the Schedule 4 of the 1958 Agreement (Rev. 3).	
15.	Rear-registration plate illuminating devices  GTB will study this subject (see SLR-46-10) and the discussion will resume at SLR when a proposal will be available.	SLR-46-10
