

## **Transportation from the Airport:**

#### From OAK to downtown SF

o Taxi:

About a \$55 fare

#### o BART:

- The AirBART shuttle bus travels between OAK and the Coliseum/Oakland Airport BART Station every 10 minutes during the day & it takes 30 minutes or less to reach downtown San Francisco.
  - An AirBART fare is \$3.00 for an adult.
  - The AirBART shuttle trip takes approximately 15 minutes & stops in front of the Coliseum/Oakland Airport BART Station on San Leandro Blvd. and in front of Terminal 1 and 2 [Southwest Airlines].
  - AirBART schedule:
    - o Monday-Saturday: 6 am -12 midnight every 10 minutes
    - Sunday: 8 am 12 midnight every 10 minutes
- Board a BART San Francisco/Daly City bound train and get off at either the Embarcadero or Montgomery Street stop [designated by stars on the above map].

#### From SFO to downtown SF

#### o Taxi:

- Taxis depart from the designated taxi zones located at the roadway center islands, on the Arrivals/Baggage Claim level of all terminals.
- An approximate fare to downtown San Francisco is \$45.

#### o BART:

- The BART station at SFO is located in the International Terminal.
  - You can also take the free AirTrain from any terminal directly to the BART station.
    - o Just follow the signs to AirTrain and board the Red Line train.
    - o When you arrive, take the escalator down to the departures level and walk straight ahead to the BART station.
    - o Terminals 1, 2, & 3 are approximately a 1-3 minute AirTrain ride to the BART station.
- Board the BART Pittsburg/Bay Point train and get off at either the Embarcadero or Montgomery station stops [designated by stars on the map of downtown SF]. The meeting location and the ICCT office are located closest to the Montgomery station.
  - A one-way ticket from SFO to downtown is \$8.25.
  - Trains arrive at the SFO International Terminal every 15 minutes and it's just 30 minutes to downtown San Francisco.
  - BART schedule:
    - o Weekday SFO Airport Service Hours: 4 am 11:45 pm
    - o Weekend SFO Airport Service Hours:
      - Saturday: 6 am 11:45 pm
      - Sunday: 8 am 11:45 pm
