5.	Document SLR-52-01/Rev.1 is the latest collection of errors identified in Regs 148.01 and 149.01. After the next meeting (SLR-53) this document will be used to generate two formal proposals for GRE-86.	
6.	Organisation of Special separate session on "Headlamp levelling"	
	Dr. Kooss offered to lead the discussion within a small group of volunteers (namely: Ms. Berthel (OICA), Dr. Targosinski (PL), Mr. Toulisse (GTB), Mr. Bailey (UK) and the SLR officers Mr. Rovers and Mr. Puglisi) to define the organisational and practical details for a special "hands-on" session on "Headlamp levelling" at LTIK in Karlsruhe, tentatively on 22-23 February 2022. The outcome of this preparatory meeting will be presented at the SLR-53 session for finalisation and approval.	

#### Stage 2 / Step 2 - Specific items or general topics for consideration

The Chairman officially announced the kick-off of the Simplification "Stage 2 / Step 2". He recalled that SLR members were invited to consider, and propose, specific items or general topics that should be dealt with in this new phase of the simplification process.

All the inputs provided by OICA (SLR-52-06 and SLR-52-07), IMMA (SLR-52-08) and CEMA (SLR-52-09) were considered by SLR.

During the discussion of SLR-52-07 it was observed that it would not be suitable at this stage to "copy" the FMVSS requirements. Eventually this may be result, as the conclusion of the work, but not the starting point since the goal is to harmonise and not to copy. It was suggested to consider a "common window" among the different regulatory systems and to add a column for China for global harmonisation.

Mr. Grainger clarified that a GTR was not the purpose of the OICA paper.

Regarding Regulation 48, GTB offered to provide draft consolidated texts of the series 06, 07 and 08 and to further support as necessary.

Mr. Hernandez observed that the Stage 2 / Step 2 is a great opportunity and welcomed the idea of possible harmonisation and the idea to consider a "common window". Moreover, he reported that the input from IMMA (SLR-52-08) was only general at the moment and that detailed proposals were in preparation.

With regards to the topics proposed by CEMA (SLR-52-09), Mr. Rovers and Mr. Kooss pointed out that special warning lamps, particularly the installation and usage thereof, are managed at national level and therefore it would not be possible to insert them in the installation regulations. Mr. Fahr observed that CLCCR asked OICA to consider this aspect so he did understand the reason why it was added to the list compiled by CEMA and suggested to discuss it in GRE. The Chairman pointed out that the item can be brought to the attention of GRE but recalled that it is a matter regulated by national laws.

As a general comment, Mr. Targosinski pointed out that the Stage 2 / Step 2 should focus on three points: 1) Performance based requirements 2) Simplification of provisions 3) Harmonisation of requirements.

Document SLR-52-03/Rev.1 is the latest collection of input from CPs and NGOs. This is a living document that will be updated during a number of future SLR sessions. All CPs were invited to contribute in the discussion.

#### Time schedule Stage 2 / Step 2 and SLR mandate; Update ToR (See *Annex II to ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRE/80*)

The Chairman reported that the unexpected workload and the difficulties caused by the pandemic were the two main reasons for needing extra time in order to complete the task assigned by GRE.

After some discussion, the SLR considered that at least two extra years would be a realistic, although very demanding, time to complete the Stage 2 / Step 2 Simplification. Therefore, it was agreed to propose GRE an extension of two years of the SLR mandate, until the end of 2024.

Transitional Provisions; deadline for acceptance of type approvals issued to the preceding series of amendments (see paragraph 10 of ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRE/85)  Mr. Lazarevic recalled that the EC is not ready to adopt the 01 series of the device Regulations without this clause.  Mr. Bauckhage asked where it would be more appropriate to put an "end date": device Regulations, installation Regulations, UN Reg. 0 (IWVTA) or EU vehicle type-approval framework Regulation (i.e. the Regulation (EU) 2018/858). Mr. Lazarevic replied that the EU Regulation is not an option and should not be discussed in SLR. He added that the only options are the device or the installation UN Regulations. He also proposed a draft text for Reg. 48 (see doc. SLR-52-10, highlighted text).  Mr. Grainger informed that, in case of UN Regulation No. 48, it would generate a new series of amendments.  SLR agreed to draft an appropriate "sunset provision" to be inserted in the installation Regulations, based on the draft text proposed by Mr. Lazarevic and reflected in document SLR-52-10.
