**ESTABLISHMENT OF
UNITED NATIONS GLOBAL TECHNICAL REGULATION No. 22**

The Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, as Secretary of the Agreement, communicates the following:

On 9 March 2022, at its sixty-third session, the Executive Committee of the Agreement established the following draft United Nations Global Technical Regulation in the United Nations Global Registry, under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.22, by consensus vote (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1164, para. 136), in accordance with para. 7.2. of article 7 of Annex B to the Agreement:

United Nations Global Technical Regulation on In-vehicle battery durability for electrified vehicles (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2022/45).

The following documents are appended to UN Global Technical Regulation No. 22 under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.22/Appendix 1:

Authorization to develop a new UN GTR on In-vehicle battery durability for electrified vehicles (TRANS/WP.29/AC.3/57).

Final status report on the development of a new UN GTR on In-vehicle battery durability for electrified vehicles (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2022/46).

Reference is made in this respect to paragraph 6.4. of the 1998 Agreement on the process for amending global technical regulations, as well as paragraphs 7.1. to 7.6. of the 1998 Agreement on the adoption and notification of application of global technical regulations.
