1. Adoption of the Agenda

The Informal Working Group (IWG) on Intelligent Transport Systems (ITS) will adopt the agenda for the second session.

2. Review of the implementation of the UNECE Roadmap Intelligent Transport Systems

The IWG will be briefed on the status of the implementation of the road map adopted in February 2021. The IWG will reflect on the outcome of the three webinars organized from January to March 2022 and on possible ways to document it.

The IWG may wish to discuss the need to organize further webinars in 2022/2023.

3. Monitor and report to WP.29 on external developments

The IWG may wish to monitor activities regarding traffic laws, intelligent and connected transportation systems (including intermodal transport), telecommunications, infrastructure planning, Mobility as a Service (MaaS) and similar fields adjacent to the deployment of vehicles equipped with Automated Driving Systems.

4. Provide guidance to WP.29 on activities, outreach and collaboration with other organisations

The IWG may wish to be informed on the outcome of activities related to the group during the February 2022 session of the Inland Transport Committee.

The IWG may wish to discuss the participation of WP.29 in the UNECE/ITU Future Networked Car (FNC) event, where one of its four sessions was dedicated to WP.29.

5. Information exchange

The IWG on ITS may wish to exchange information on developments in intelligent transport systems pertinent to, but distinct from, the regulation of motor-vehicle performance.

The IWG will receive a presentation from two experts from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

- Mr. Gary Crockford - the Connected Vehicles lead in the UK Department for Transport, Traffic Technology Division; and
- Mr. Andy Fisher - the Connected and Automated Vehicles (CAV) lead in National Highways.

6. Recommendations for WP.29 consideration

The IWG may wish to prepare recommendations for WP.29 consideration to support and inform decision making across WP.29 and its subsidiary bodies on ITS related issues, if any.
