 - o Further consideration of document VRU-Proxi-25-05. The expert of FR prepared document VRU-Proxi-26-02 and provided the following comments:
 - *The proposal includes all the points of view shared during previous meeting:*
 - *All driving conditions (straight and turning maneuver wheel positions)*
 - All steering wheel adjustments/displacements
 - Head/eyes positions representative of all drivers' heights
 - Detection system alternative in case of unjustified obstructions
 - The proposal is also based on existing regulation such as Regulation No. 121 and 46. Its purpose is not to create a stringent approach in comparison with historic test approaches.
 - Two approaches are shared for discussion of the monitor view to be considered (all the screen or only the field of view).
- Paragraph 16.1.1.1.1.1 3 Modification of the view
 - o A proposal from the experts of FR and CLEPA may be discussed
 - o Document VRU-Proxi-26-03 contains the agreed content from the IWG 24th session and this document requested in the 25th session.

 - o A proposal from the expert of OICA may be discussed
