




3.3 Three 'Agreements'

- **1. 1958** < *Regulation* >
- Frame in which participating countries ('contracting parties') develop technical requirements for Type Approval of vehicles and components
- Each CP-Type Approval shall be mutually accepted
- At the moment >60 CPs, >160 Regulations
- **2. 1998** *<GTR>*
- Development of worldwide harmonised performance requirements and test procedures, CPs implement these in their own national / regional law.
- At the moment >30 CPs, >20 GTRs
- 3. 1997 <*PTI*>
- Periodic Technical Inspection
