ESTABLISHMENT OF AMENDMENT 1 TO GLOBAL TECHNICAL REGULATION No. 3

The Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, as Secretary of the Agreement, communicates the following:

On 26 June 2008, at its twenty-third session, the Executive Committee of the Agreement, in accordance with para. 7.2. of article 7 of Annex B to the Agreement, established by consensus vote (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1068, para. 65) the following draft amendment:

Amendment 1 to global technical regulation No. 3 (Motorcycles brake systems) (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2008/71).

The above amendment was established in the Global Registry as Amendment 1 to global technical regulation No. 3, entitled "MOTORCYCLES BRAKE SYSTEMS", under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.3/Amend.1.
