**ESTABLISHMENT OF AMENDMENT 2 TO
GLOBAL TECHNICAL REGULATION No. 3**

The Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, as Secretary of the Agreement, communicates the following:

On 12 March 2015, at its forty-third session, the Executive Committee of the Agreement established the following amendment in Global Registry, under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.3/Amend.2, by consensus vote (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1114, para. 101) in accordance with paragraph 7.2. of Annex B to the Agreement:

Amendment 2 to global technical regulation No. 3 (Motorcycles brake systems) (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2015/38 and ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1114 and Corr.1, para. 102).

The above amendment was established in the Global Registry as Amendment 2 to global technical regulation No. 3, entitled "MOTORCYCLES BRAKE SYSTEMS", under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.3/Amend.2.
