Done at Geneva on 25 June 1998.

This is a status report provided in accordance with Article 7.4 of the above-mentioned Agreement with respect to the global technical regulation (gtr) No. 6 regarding Safety Glazing.

Canada continues its national regulatory process vis-à-vis gtr No. 6. At the present time, we are still considering the best way of adopting the provisions of gtr No. 6 into section No. 205 of the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulation*.

Further information regarding Canada's decision on possible adoption of the provisions of gtr No. 6 will be communicated to the Secretary General in due time.
