**ESTABLISHMENT OF AMENDMENT 2
TO UNITED NATIONS GLOBAL TECHNICAL REGULATION No. 9**

The Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, as Secretary of the Agreement, communicates the following:

On 14 November 2018, at its fifty-fourth session, the Executive Committee of the Agreement established the following amendment in the Global Registry, under the symbol ECE/TRANS/180/Add.9/Amend.2, by consensus vote (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1142, para. 176), in accordance with para. 7.2. of article 7 of Annex B to the Agreement:

Amendment 2 to United Nations Global Technical Regulation No. 9 on Pedestrian Safety (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2018/160).
