Passengers must have: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival; or- a negative COVID-19 PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before arrival. The test certificate must be in English.- This does not apply to passengers younger than 12 years.	Restriction level	Partially Restrictive

1. Measures aiming to Facilitate the Cross-border Movement of Relief and Essential Supplies

- 1.1. On line processing of declarations & e-payment
- 1.2. Most of small borders closed to streamline cargo traffic to minimise risks and use of x-ray cargo scanners for examination
- 1.3. Expedited clearance of COVID-19 consignments

2. Measures aiming at Supporting the Economy and Sustaining Supply Chain Continuity

- 2.1. Have a list of Essential goods that are needed to support the economy
- 2.2. Government has established a COVID-19 wage subsidy to support business and employees of affected business

3. Measures aiming at Protecting Customs administrations' Staff

- 3.1. All officers are provided with PPE's
- 3.2. Some staff members are allowed to work at home to avoid congestion
- 3.3. Introduction of flexi and shift work in inland stations

4. Measures aiming at Protecting Society

- 4.1. Encourage members of public to utilise e-platforms for clearance of goods and payments
- 4.2. Introduced permits to control movement of persons
- 4.3. Mounting of road blocks to control and enforce the law

5. Other Measures.

- 5.1. Tobacco & tobacco products prohibited and Alcoholic beverages
- 5.2. Exemption of goods needed to fight COVID-19
- 5.3. Relax penalties and easing of return submission
